## Cabin Fever? Pursue a hobby! (with help from the library)

We talk a lot about what programs are available at the library, how we can provide services, and what's new at the library! But, what if you can't do those things, what's in the library for me? Why should I like my library? (February is “Love Your Library” month). So I'm going to share some reasons why you will really love your library along with loving your hobbies.

During the winter, many people suffer from the winter blahs, blues, or plain old depression. We are reminded to be active, get some fresh air and exercise, do something to keep your brains active as well. So this is a good time to talk about HOBBIES. Many people have hobbies, they range from reading, cooking, sewing, crafts, genealogy, coin or stamp collecting, puzzles, games (both board and computer), drawing, painting, photography, woodworking, small engine repair, and many more. All of these activities are good for you especially during this winter season and your library can help you with nearly all (if not all of them).

Of course, we have books of all kinds and if we don't own them, we can Inter-library loan them. Don't forget audio books on CD, and ebooks and audio books through Hoopla and the State Library. So if your hobby is reading that is an easy one, just come in and get a book, or call us and we'll help you set up your Hoopla account, or get you going with the resources from the state library. (Hint—You will need to know your library number and password to set up those accounts).

Bookmark this site on your device (computer, phone, tablet) [lacygne.biblionix.com/catalog](https://lacygne.biblionix.com/catalog) This is a very helpful site for many reasons. You login in with your library number and password (ask for it if you don't know it) in the upper right hand corner, then look on the left hand side under electronic resources and you will see State Library and Hoopla. The ones I want to focus on are listed a bit further down the list: My Herit-

age Library Edition and Hobbies and Crafts Reference Center. You will be amazed what you can find to help you with your genealogy and craft hobbies. Once you are logged in, you can access all the information, save or print what you need. My Heritage Library is similar to Ancestry, as far as searching, but a more reasonably priced subscription for libraries and our patrons. Spend some time browsing through the program and see what you can add to your family tree or how to start your family tree. We also have some indexes to births, deaths, and marriages on our website <https://lacygnelibrary.org/services/> click on the Genealogy and History Tab. It is a rather large pdf file and continues to grow as we get more things indexed. You can search for names, and then contact the library for copies of the information.

Hobbies and Crafts Reference Center is an amazing collection of materials to help you with your favorite pastime. These are the major subject heading that you will find: Arts & Crafts, Collecting, Home & Garden, Indoor Recreation, Kids Crafts, Model Building, Needlecraft & Textiles, Outdoor Recreation, Performing Arts, Science & Technology, Scrapbooking & Paper Crafts. If that is not enough click on the “View All Topics” and a much longer list of hobbies are given for you to checkout. Some of those more specific topics include things like sculpting, winemaking, weaving, wood burning, radio controlled models, pottery and many more choices.

The State Databases have Fold3 and Heritage Quest and other genealogy resources available. Other things that might be of interest are the Auto Repair link and Universal Class which allows you to use your Kansas Library Card (get one at library) to take classes on many different topics. No reason to suffer from Cabin Fever this winter, check out the Hobby Resources available from the library that you can access at home.

## Niche Academy Comes to the Library



If you go to our new website and look on the right hand side you will see a button like this that says Learning! Click that button from any page on our website and it will bring in a sidebar from Niche academy. We are currently working on getting items added to our academy, but I want you to get familiar with it. It will be used to archive the Facebook live story hours, which will be accessed like checking out a book. You will use your library card number and password from biblionix to access these archived story hours anytime. But there's more, we will be able to put little training videos on there for the Memory Lab stuff and other things that you might need a lesson and the staff doesn't always have time to stop and train you right then.

The biggest advantage is that Niche Academy has lots of training videos already out there, so we do not have to create everything. Some training videos already out there include: How to Use Bookflix, How to use Ebsco Database, How to use Google Docs, Drive, Forms, Photos, Sheets, and Slides, How to use Zoom, How to use Linked in, and How to Use Twitter. We will be adding more tutorials for you to use, and if there is a program or app that you would like more information about, call us and we'll see if they have one created or can create a tutorial to help you.

When asked how they (Niche Academy) can help small public libraries, this was their response. "Niche Academy creates and maintains up-to-date video tutorials for library eResources. It gives libraries a simple way to make these tutorials easy to find on the library website. It eliminates the distractions and extra navigation steps that are inevitable with YouTube videos or links to vendor websites. It is, quite simply, the easiest way to provide video tutorials for library patrons."

These are not long complicated tutorials, they include screenshots of what you will see on your computer screen. Take advantage of these tutorials and if you have children or grandchildren visiting check out the story times, most of the crafts can be done with things from around the house.

We're always working to find things to help our patrons increase their knowledge and supplying resources to make that easier for everyone. Check out Niche Academy on our website.


## Temporary Changes at the Library
