The Power of Play—Do Games and Playtime Help Children?

I've always been intrigued by the discussions of the value of playtime and recently it is coming across my desk more often. We have become a tv, tablet, phone, technology driven society and the trend is to use them as babysitters for our young children. "They're playing games, listening to kids music, being stimulated by all kinds of sounds, movement and colors, Isn't that enough?"

Sad to say, no it's not enough, Technology is good and has a purpose (as I sit here using technology to complete most of my job). But technology doesn't and never will replace "real" playtime. Our children don't use their imagination, they don't create, they don't communicate, and they are sedentary, which is probably the biggest issue.

According to the American Academy of Pediatrics the following are benefits of play.

(1) Play supports healthy brain development (2) Play is one way children engage and interact with their environment. (3) Play allows children to safely explore their fears and practice adult roles. (4) Play is how children build relationships with peers and caregivers. That is a lot of positive that comes from play. Explora-

their imagination and creativity to build a house, a skyscraper, a rocket, a cave, you name it, I've seen them do it. We have costumes (thanks to Parents as Teachers) that allow them to explore adult roles, such as fireman, postman, doctor and more. We have dolls, trucks, cars, tractors, excavators and much more for them to explore and experience.

We have letters for them to play with and learn colors, sounds, and eventually create words. The gears teach them reactions, cause and effect if I push this what happens. Our boards on the wall (thanks to SEK Library grant) have them standing and looking straight at things, and crossing midline to operate them.


Some people may see a simple playroom, but I see a room that encourages children




